Through the pastor who invited us we heard that more people kept wanting to join their church. We praise the Lord for what His word did in the hearts.

Per and I begin to feel at home and have moved into the house in Denmark at Blåhøjvej 49 at Karstoft. We are not done working on the house yet but we can do the remaining although we already moved in.

We had to make room for Mom and Dad to come and stay next door at the MUSEUM (Torkild's Dad's old house ⁽ⁱ⁾). It is wonderful to have them this close. They have been helping us with various projects at our house. And we can work closely together in the missionary work - not having to a continent to divide us.. We can meet in person.

Emergency aid projects

As earlier mentioned, my trip to Tanzania was planned to be on 1 September, but it has been put off till 13 October. This is partly because Mom and Dad are in Denmark now and Dad and I need to go and inspect new projects in Tanzania together.

One of the areas where we bring aid has been closed down due to corona as the authorities decided to avoid a spreading of the disease. We have been out putting poison in our stores of corn so that no beetles get into the corn. Thanks to the team!

Neema got her life back



We have 25 children at the time in various hospitals and treatment centers that we work with. This is a big challenge to the team but also it is a big joy for us to see the many children that get help for a better life.



At some point she herself got big problems with her heart and needed an angioplasty. The hospital where she works in Arusha does not give those kinds of treatments. Therefore she was moved to a hospital specialized in heart surgeries. It was very expensive and as her husband lost his job she turned to me for help. Lina's surgery went well, praise the Lord.

A big loss for us and for Tanzania

During the week when Torkild was away something happened that shook us deeply. Our German friends and neighbors, Friedhelm and Rosy fell ill (you probably remember that we wrote about Friedhelm many times. He built several churches with the help of Torkild in large parts of Tanzania). Rosy wrote to us to hear how we were doing because they had gotten a temperature and felt bad. Their maid was very ill with covid-19. Seemingly, she had passed it on to Friedhelm and Rosy.



I immediately suggested that they saw a doctor, but Rosy said Friedhelm was so sick that he could not sit in a car to get to the doctor. Finally, the doctor instead came to their house. Friedhelm was admitted to a missionary hospital approx. 150 km from Arusha with doctors from the West.

The day after Torkild's return Rosy called and said that Friedhelm's condition had worsened. Possibly he would be taken by plane to a hospital in Dar es Salaam or Nairobi. She had forgotten their passports so Torkild decided to take the passports to the hospital with our driver, Hilary to see if he could help.

In the meantime the doctor had talked to Rosy and advised her not to move Friedhelm as his condition was extremely critical. The problem is that most Tanzanian hospitals do not have any respirators. And they needed one for Friedhelm.

At noon the following day after Torkild had arrived in the hospital, Friedhelm passed away, quietly and peacefully.

It was big a shock to his wife who had no relatives around her. She immediately began calling the children to inform them of their father's passing. The body had to be moved from the hospital before evening on the same day, as they have no cooling rooms. Hilary drove the body in Friedhelm's car and Torkild took Rosy in our car. They drove to a hospital in Arusha where Friedhelm was put in a cooler.

Friedhelm had earlier expressed that he wanted to be buried in Tanzania. He received a truly royal funeral. He was buried at our FPCT church in Ngaramtoni, which is the local church that we work with.

He leaves behind his wife and four children. One of the sons came to be a part of the funeral.

Late summer visit to Denmark

After the funeral we decided to go to Denmark to take part in some family parties and to be vaccinated against corona.

Unfortunately, Torkild fell sick with corona a few days after arriving. And two days later, I, Tabitha got sick.

We managed the illness fairly easily and were declared well after a week. We got out of our isolation and could finally visit our children, in-laws and grandchildren.

We will be vaccinated on 22 September and 13 October and will go back to Tanzania on 22 October.







From a tent to a brick house

Do you remember the family we wrote about in our last letter who lived under a tent cloth? We helped them buy a plot of ground so that they could build a house. At this moment they have begun building and we hope to be able to show their new home around Christmastime. Our building team has been busy with other things and therefore the construction has been delayed. But the family is in a rented house now and is doing fine. 
It is expensive to be sick in Tanzania

She asks for help to begin afresh.

Mirjam has been helping a little two year old boy who had been diagnosed with cancer in his one eye. It was necessary to remove the eye and give him a class eye. The surgery went well and the little boy looks so cute, even with this glass eye.
